In its relatively new, large space, Mill Valley Art & Paper has a wonderful selection of art supplies for adults and children. You'll find many types of paint, brushes, chalk, clay, canvases, and lots of art and specialty papers. The store's classes are primarily aimed at "tweens" ages 7-11, because, according to Steve Black, who teaches comic book drawing, that age tends not to have as many local art classes to choose from. The store is offering a "season sampler" of classes Tues.-Fri., July 8-11, during which a different artist will teach in a different medium each day. Classes will include drawing and painting, pastels, crafts, and comics. The 4-day sampler costs \$135. A catalog of other classes will be available mid-July, in the store and on the web site. There are shelves chocked full of art and craft kits, supplies, unpainted wooden items, and creative toys, as well as a big table where kids ages 2 and up can drop in with a parent to make a project such as a mirror, a picture frame, or a decorated apron. All materials and instructions are provided. 45-minute sessions are \$6.50 each, or \$55 for 10 visits and include unlimited paint and paper in addition to a choice from the weekly projects.
